

Guide Signing at Intersections

Policy Statement

Uniform application of guide sign display and placement shall be maintained on all types of roadways along the provincial secondary highway network.

Rationale

Standardization of sign display and positioning provide a clear and expected conveyance of information to travellers throughout the province.

Policy Objectives

- Provide clear, relative information in a legible format with consideration to the ageing population.
- Provide reasonable guidelines for placement to promote safe driver decision making.
- Use of high quality materials in the manufacturing and installation processes for the greatest cost-benefit and sign life.

Application

This policy applies to all responsible for provincially owned and maintained secondary roads and highways.

Accountability

The Area Managers and Supervisors shall be responsible for the administration and implementation of this policy.

Monitoring

The Supervisor, or their designate, will be responsible for the sign implementation and ensuring they are placed in accordance with the guidelines and appropriate plan. The Area Manager and the District Traffic Authority shall be responsible for the monitoring of this policy.
